<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>		High school transcripts with GPA and ACT scores noted on transcript are required unless you have a BS degree.
		An applicant with a GED certificate must have a 50 overall score with a score of 50 on all sections. If the GED scores do not meet these requirements, then the applicant must have a college cumulative GPA of 3.0.
		College transcripts.

	We prefer for all courses to be completed by deadline however; if you must take a class later, you will have until the 1 st week of August to have final grades sent. Due to this being after interviews, acceptance is contingent on a passing grade.

		The applicant must have a minimum cumulative college GPA of a 2.5.
		GPA must be noted on all transcripts.

		Composite score of 18 is required.
		If an applicant has a score of less than 18; then they must have a cumulative college GPA of 3.0 or higher.
		The ACT is not required if the applicant has a BS degree in any subject with a minimum final cumulative GPA of 2.5.
		ACT score cannot be older than 10 years.
		We only accept the National ACT. In accordance with ACT, the residual ACT is only for the school it was taken for.
		We do not require the writing portion of the ACT.

		Three reference letters from individuals other than family are required. The letters can be mailed, faxed or emailed.
		All three letters must be postmarked or received no later than May 31 st .
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	8-hour observation visit – <i>subject to change based on visitation rules</i>	
		An observation visit is where the applicant will be toured to some of the clinical educational sites where training will occur. This is your chance to see what a Radiologic Technologist does throughout the day. You will be notified by the School Agent when it is time to schedule. These visits are only done after your application has been received.

		An interview will be scheduled for all applicants who have completed requirements by the deadline. This is scheduled by the School Agent and you will be notified by email. Interviews are only held once and are in late June.

		If accepted, applicant must pass a background check and complete the DCH pre-employment physical prior to school start date in September. This will be scheduled by and through DCH.
